

Fact Sheet – Thai Rice (Nationally Appropriate Mitigation Action) NAMA

Problem	Rice is particularly important as it is cultivated on roughly half of all agricultural land in Thailand and accounts for nearly 55% of emissions from agriculture. Thailand is the world's fourth-largest emitter of rice-related greenhouse gas. In irrigated rice production, flooding of paddy fields leads to significant emissions of methane, which has a global warming potential 28 times higher than carbon dioxide. The lack of incentives available to farmers is also preventing a transition to low-emission rice production practices.
Background [text]	Thai Rice NAMA, funded by NAMA Facility, is a joint project with the Thai government to encourage local peasants to implement low-emission rice farming and make mitigation services and technologies accessible to farmers.
Objectives/Goals [text]	To transform the entire rice sector into low-emission production with 100,000 farmer households expected to benefit from the project.
Project period [text]	August 2018 – August 2023

‘Rice farmers’ key players in fight against climate change
Project period: August 2018 – August 2023

The flooded rice paddies are known to be one of the major contributors to climate change and produce vast amounts of methane greenhouse gas, which has a global warming potential 28 times higher than carbon dioxide.

Realizing the threats, local farmers are adjusting themselves by applying low-carbon farming techniques – land leveling, alternate wetting and drying, site-specific nutrient management, and straw and stubble management with recommendations and supports from Thai Rice NAMA Project’s experienced field staffs and local government officials.

A change in farming practices will gradually transform the entire rice sector into low-emission production and make lives of farmers more pleasant.

what benefits do farmers and us get?

- Farmers pay less for petrol needed for pumping water as the laser land leveling flattens the field surface to allow water to reach every part of the field with minimum time spent.
- Farmers no longer worry about inadequate savings or debt because they can sell their rice at fair price.
- Farmers don’t have to worry about switching costs because the project offers them an access to revolving funds.
- Sustainable rice farming practices increase productivity and improve yield.
- Sustainable rice cultivation abates the negative impacts of climate change.
- Straw and stubble management reduces open-burning of agricultural residues, resulting in the improvement of air quality.
- Consumers enjoy rice that has better nutrition and safer to eat.

Lampliang has long overused fertilizer in her rice farming. She had misunderstood that, to boost rice production, a massive amount of fertilizer is the easy way out. She never realized her practice was not the right solution until she joined the SARI - Thailand project and learned to apply appropriate fertilizer instead.

Her rice yield jumped by 40% from 2017. Now, she lives happily with her family and enjoys producing rice of consistent quality and superior taste that she also eats.

Because climate change is real and it affects farming households. Farmers, the backbones of Thailand, realize the impacts and prepare to put on their boxing gloves to fight against it.

With a support of Thai Rice NAMA, a joint project funded by NAMA Facility with the Thai government and the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH, farmers in central plains start applying low-carbon and sustainable rice farming practices.

Hom Mali ...
rice farmers in northeastern Thailand enjoy sweet smell of success

Standing in a field of Hom Mali rice in noyae district of Ubon Ratchathani, Boonterm Luandee happily looked at her improved rice production which brought her higher income in recent years.


Ms. Boonterm has long overused inorganic farm inputs on her Hom Mali rice paddy field and never realized a small change in her cultivating method would put an end to her struggle to make ends meet.

“The quality of rice was not good and I could not shake my debt off,” she said.

The unsatisfactory production led Ms. Boonterm to try out new farming technique in 2015.



After undergoing a training conducted by rice farming experts from BRRI and applying new knowledge to her 11 rai of Hom Mali rice, she earned 30,000 - 45,000 baht (800-1200 EUR), up from 10,000 - 20,000 baht in previous harvesting seasons.

Since then, Ms. Boonterm decided to rely on less pesticide and more biological plant protection products.
